After 30 years we feel it is time to refurbish the Woodhouse Craft Centre. So, we are painting the walls first and then replacing the very worn carpet with a new safe tread wooden floor. The strip lights were updated in July to LEDs and the lighting is visibly better.

I have been clearing out the Centre which has accumulated stuff over the years which we don't need. Some items were sold on Ebay, but a lot have gone through Freecycle, and this has brought people into the Centre for the first time.



This work is being done while we are closed over Christmas. The week before Christmas is the painting and the week after will see the floor being laid. As a result, we are planning to get the Centre back to normal on Tuesday 2nd January so we will not reopen to members until Wednesday 3rd January.

We are almost there with our fundraising challenge, and the community has been amazing but, following advice from suppliers, we've decided to go for a better quality floor which will last for years. So now we have to raise more money than expected. If you can help in any way, we would be very grateful. Perhaps you might be thinking of giving to charity instead of sending Christmas cards?


